### **Name of Bid**

New York City bid for SMOFcon 2023 (originally for 2022)

### **What dates are you bidding for?**

We are bidding the traditional SMOFCon dates, which would be December 1–3 in 2023.

### **What is your proposed convention host city? Is your convention site in a city center location or a suburb? If a suburb, what are the transport options into the city centre? How far is the site from the city centre?**

We do not anticipate being in the city center (midtown Manhattan) for reasons detailed below. We will be looking at venues near either JFK or LGA airports, which could be considered suburban, but are still within the confines of NYC.

[To answer a question asked previously by more than one person, we don't anticipate that it will be possible to get a venue in Manhattan for SMOFCon's customary dates. Early December is in the NYC holiday season (roughly Thanksgiving to New Year's), during which there is absolutely no incentive for hotels in Manhattan to offer anything less than what the market will bear. It doesn't mean we won't look, but we have little hope of finding anything. *It is possible that the effects of the pandemic may motivate these hotels to offer better rates; it is also highly possible that we will have recovered enough that it doesn't matter.*]

The leads on our bid are Joni Brill Dashoff, Catelynn Cunningham, and Mark W. Richards.

The following listing of experience of our leads is not exhaustive or complete, but should serve to give an idea of the depth of our experience:

Joni was co-chair of SMOFCon 30, treasurer for the Millennium Philcon, art show head for many conventions, and a department and area head for conventions from the local to the Worldcon level over the course of many years. She has also run site selection at Worldcons.

Catelynn is a founder of HELIOSphere\*, and chaired the 2nd and 3rd instances of that convention. She ran green room at Arisia 2017 and 2018 and the entire food area in 2019. She assisted in art show at WFC in 2018 and 2019 and at Anticipation and Aussiecon 4. She also has experience with conferences not in the fannish field. She is running at-con treasury at Discon 3 and will be division head for hospitality at Chicon 8.

Mark is a founder of HELIOSphere\*, and chaired the first convention. He worked on publications for the Dublin Worldcon and edited the Artist Showcase for MidAmericon 2. He has assisted in more than a few art shows, including several WFCs, Anticipation, and Aussiecon

4, and before his hiatus from conrunning fandom in the late 90s to early 00s ran a couple (for Lunacon). He's also worked on many of the conventions in the northeast and mid-Atlantic seaboard — Lunacon, Boskone, Philcon, Balticon, etc. He will be on treasury staff for Discon 3 and is on publications staff (progress reports) for Chicon 8.

## **TRAVEL**

**What is the typical current airfare to your closest airport from world cities such as London, Boston, Dublin, Los Angeles, Tokyo, Brisbane, etc.?**

*Airports:*

John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK), LaGuardia Airport (LGA), Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR).

***JFK and EWR are international gateways serving a world city. Just about all international carriers fly into JFK.***

There are also secondary commercial airports at Islip (Long Island), White Plains (Westchester County) and Newburgh (Stewart, in Orange County).

*Flight costs (rough estimates):*

Current ~4-week purchase, round trip as of this writing (Expedia, rounded), into JFK unless specified:

Los Angeles	\$200
Tokyo	\$1300
Sydney (i/o Melbourne)	\$1900

(These prices are *very* approximate and may still be depressed due to COVID; when we first completed a questionnaire for our bid, some were considerably higher.)

*Other transport options serving NYC (trains, bus service:*

Train: Amtrak, Northeast Corridor service, as well as service into the Midwest and South and up to Canada.

Bus: long haul and short haul service with all major carriers into Port Authority

Bus Terminal in midtown Manhattan (except for BoltBus and MegaBus, which start/terminate nearby).

*Transport from airport to hotel:*

Since we are looking mostly at venues near JFK or LGA airports, proximity to airports is a trivial matter (cab, hotel shuttle). There are mass transit options from elsewhere in NYC, mainly midtown Manhattan, which is where any trains or buses would come in, to those airports. When we have a venue, there will be more specific transit directions.

We are looking at hotels close to either of the major NYC airports actually within New York (JFK or LGA).

NYC is very strict with regards to indoor smoking ... NO SMOKING ... take it outside, and probably not close to the building.

**Given the current pandemic, have you considered any arrangements have been made for social distancing and the health and safety of members? If you have, can you describe what your current plans are?**

Social distancing, masking in public, and decreased occupancy of public spaces such as restaurants, auditoriums, etc. has been the norm in NYC for much of the last year. Eating in restaurants, indoors, requires proof of vaccination, as does attendance at theatrical performances, etc. At this point, we will also be requiring proof of vaccination at any convention we hold, whether our own HELIOSphere or a Smofcon. We don't expect requirements to be relaxed

quickly or easily, perhaps not even by 2023. We will adapt to the new norms, whatever they are, and will adjust our policies accordingly to ensure the health and safety of our members.

**What type of weather can we expect during your convention? What is the average temperature during that time of year?**

**What are some of the main tourist attractions of your city?**

We would like to bring convention running fans from around the world — North America, Europe, and even Asia — together to exchange ideas on where fandom, as expressed in our conventions, has been, where we’d like it to go, and how our different approaches might help each other. Located at a world crossroads, we feel that we are well located to accomplish this goal. We plan on making it happen by fostering diversity and by soliciting from as wide a fannish population as possible, both traditional and non-traditional, ideas for program, activities, etc.

**What changes or challenges do you expect the current pandemic to present?**

We have no expectations, feeling that the next couple of years are a moving target. Social distancing and decreased room occupancies may still be a norm; if so, we will deal with that. If masking in public spaces is also still a norm or required, we will enforce that.

**Have you planned for a virtual component to your convention?**

We have no plans as yet, but we do have experience in running a virtual convention. The 2020 HELIOSphere, scheduled for April, had to be cancelled less than a month beforehand. On 2–3 weeks notice, we conceived of and ran one of the first virtual conventions of the current pandemic era. The 2021 HELIOSphere was also a virtual convention.
